John A. Bollheimer Claimed In Hospital

Death concluded a lingering illness for John A. Bollheimer, a business man here many years, shortly before 8 a. m. Wednesday in Piqua Memorial hospital. Mr. Bollheimer, who was 75, had been ill with complications the past eight months, and for eight weeks had been confined to bed.

Funeral services have been arranged for 9 a. m. Saturday, Rev. Fr. Otto Mueller to sing the requiem high mass. Burial will be made in the church cemetery.

A native of Ft. Loramie, Mr. Bollheimer was born May 5, 1871, a son of Andrew and Katherine Lang Bollheimer. He married Anna Luckman in September of 1896. She survives with a daughter, Mrs. Hulda Ayers, Dayton, and two sons, Norman R., of Columbus, and Verliott R., at home.

Three brothers and a sister are living. They are William Bollheimer and Mrs. Lucy Emminger, Dayton, and Henry and Rinehart Bollheimer, Ft. Loramie. There are two grandchildren, Lois and Maxine Ayers. Three brothers are dead.

Mr. Bollheimer spent many years in the plumbing and heating business here, and became widely known throughout the community. His business place was located for a long period in the east room of the present Hoying - Westerheide hardware store. In late years he operated from his residence. He worked at his trade up to the time of his illness which forced him to stop.

He was a member of the Catholic church all his life, and received the last sacrament of his faith. Fraternally, he was a member of the Minster aerie of Eagles.
