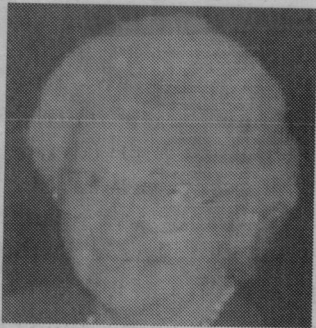


Emily "Jean" Timmerman
