

Minster Native Is Claimed At Sidney

Rites For Anton Wiggenhorn
Held In Holy Angels
Church Thursday

Anton Wiggenhorn, 71, died shortly after midnight Tuesday in Wilson hospital at Sidney, where he had submitted to emergency surgery last Thursday. He had been ill two weeks and when he became serious was rushed to the hospital in the hope that an operation would improve his condition.

For more than 40 years Mr. Wiggenhorn had been a resident of Sidney, going there to locate from Minster, where he was born Aug. 1, 1867. He was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. John Wiggenhorn.

His marriage with Miss Anna Budde was solemnized in April of 1891, and she mourns his passing with one daughter, Mrs. Fred Cook, of Sidney. Their only son, Herbert, was killed in an automobile accident 12 years ago. A daughter died in infancy.

One brother and sister survive. They are Henry Wiggenhorn of Minster, and Mrs. John Gaier of Richmond, Ind.

Anton Wiggenhorn was widely known in Minster and Sidney, and was esteemed by all who knew him. For the past 18 years he had been employed at the plant of the Monarch Machine Tool Co., and for the same number of years was formerly employed by the Buckeye Churn Co.

He was a member of the Holy Angels church. Fraternally he was a member of the Eagle lodge.

Funeral services were held at Holy Angels church Thursday at 9 a. m., in charge of Rev. E. C. Lehman. Burial was made in Graceland cemetery.
