

Native Minsterite Is Buried At Piqua

Services For Anna Wack Are
Conducted In Church
There Monday

Mrs. Anna Wack, 71, a former resident of Minster, died at her home in Piqua early last Friday morning, from complications. She had been ill for 10 months, since the death of her husband, and was bedfast practically all this time.

Born in Minster as Anna Woehmyer, a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry Woehmyer, she received her education here and was married 33 years ago in St. Augustine's church. Forty years ago she went with her husband to Piqua, and they established their home in that city. When in Minster, he was employed at the Augustine Cooperative Co.

Seven sons and two daughters are left. They are: John, of Pittsburgh; Harry, of Piqua; William, living in Minnesota; Edward, of Dayton; Carl, of Dayton; George, a professor at Notre Dame university; Frank, of Piqua; and Miss Mary and Miss Margaret, at home. One son, Leo, preceded his parents in death.

Two sisters, Mrs. Charles Bernhold of Minster, and Sister Alethia, an instructor in the schools at Columbus Grove, are left.

Mrs. Wack was well known to the older residents in Minster. Since leaving here she has returned for many visits. She leaves a number of relatives here.

Funeral services were held at 9 a. m. Monday at the St. Boniface Catholic church in Piqua, and interment was made in the St. Boniface cemetery.
