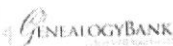

MINSTER—Requiem high mass will be sung at 9 a. m. Wednesday in St. Augustine's Catholic Church by the Rev. William Meyer for Mrs. Katherine Dues, 64, widow of John Dues, local industrialist, who died Saturday night of cancer at the Joint Township Memorial Hospital in St. Marys. Burial will be in the church cemetery.

A lifetime resident here, Mrs. Dues is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Ross Farran, Fontana, Calif.; Mrs. Geneva Kerber and Mrs. Arthur Mescher, both of here; two sons, Irvin and Paul, both of Minster; 12 grandchildren; a sister, Mrs. Lottie Artkamp, McCartyville; three brothers, Albert Brandewie, Fort Loramie; Edward Brandewie, Dayton, and Lawrence Brandewie, Minster.

Her husband, whom she married in 1914, died in 1942. Mrs. Dues was a member of the auxiliaries of the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars and Knights of St. John, and also of the St. Monica Society of the church and the Catholic Ladies of Columbia.

The body will remain at the N. J. Hogenkamp Sons Funeral Home until time of the services.

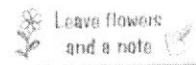
