Tuesday evening at 6 o'clock, the hand of death summoned Ferdinand Laut, popular New Bremen citizen, after an illness of several weeks duration. Death occurred at the family residence on North Main street. Funeral services were held this afternoon at 2 o'clock from the residence, the sermon proper having been rendered by Rev. R. W. Bioemker of Zion's Reformed church in the chapel of the German-Protestant cemetery, where interment was held.

Ferdinand Laut was born in New Bremen on February 22, 1862. He was reared here and was a life-time citizen of this town. Mr. Laut was a molder by trade, in which calling he proved himself to be a most efficient and experienced man. During the time when business was slack in the foundry shops he devoted much of his time to painting. Until recently he held a position with the O. O. Poorman Company. In years gone by he was also employed as head molder with the New Bremen Bridge and Plow Co. Thirty three years ago he was joined in marriage to Miss Georgina Knost, which union gave issue to nine children, two daughters having preceded their father in death. At the time of death he had attained the age of 53 years, 1 month and 14 days.

His passing away is mourned by the widow, 4 sons, LeRoy of Dayton. Raymond of Hamilton, Willis and Donald at home; 3 daughters, Rose of Middletown, Louetta of Findlay, and Heien at home; also four brothers Herman, Henry J. C., John and Göttlieb; I sister, Mrs. Fred Ende, all of here, together with a large circle of other near-of-kin and friends.
