Clarence Ley Rites Held This Morning

Funeral services for Clarence J. Ley, 63, New Bremen contractor, whose death early Monday morning was attributed to a heart ailment, were held this morning. Rev. Leo H. Boeke celebrated the requiem high mass in Holy Redeemer church. Burial was in the St. Augustine church cemetery at Minster.

Mr. Ley was born October 1, 1888, at Minster, the son of Louis E. and Anna Lambert Ley. His marriage to Miss Louise Gerwels, who survives him, took place January 27, 1907.

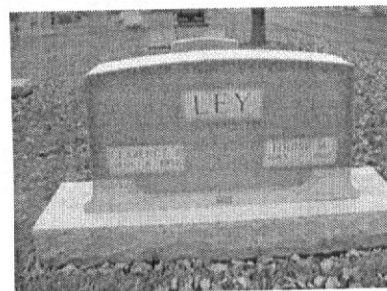
Apprenticed in early youth in the contracting business operated by his father, Mr. Ley took over the business upon the latter's retirement. His first contract of consequence in New Bremen was the boulevard light installation along Monroe and Washington sts. in 1925. Only recently he had the low bid on the new wing to be added to the South Walnut st. high school building. The contract, however, has not yet been awarded by the board of education.

Mr. Ley's death occurred in the home he erected here about 15 years ago at 16 North Jefferson st. He was a former member of the New Bremen board of public affairs.

Besides the widow, a brother and five sisters survive. They are LeRoy Ley, Minster, Mrs. Rose Runkle, Mrs. Della Ostendorf, Mrs. George Meyer, Dayton, Mrs. Charlotte Schock, Brookville, O., and Mrs. Jack Fagan, Long Island, N. Y.
