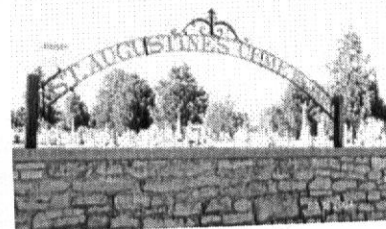

 Mrs. Mary Schuler whose family home was No. 56, Freyburg Street in this town, died Tuesday night at 11 o'clock at the Good Samaritan Hospital at Cincinnati following an operation, well attended with the usual sacraments of the Catholic Church at the age of 48 years, 3 months and 5 days.  
 Mrs. Schuler had her death two weeks before her death to have an operation performed for gall stones, the fourth during the last few years. A rupture that developed lately still increased her sufferings and aggravated her condition. The deceased was more or less sick four years.  
 Mrs. Mary Schuler was born here in the year 1871, June 9th, a daughter of the late Peter Vanderhorst and wife Mary. She spent her days up to her marriage at the parental home in this town. On May 12, 1891 she was married to Mr. George Schuler of Cincinnati at the St. Augustine church. Mrs. Schuler's married life was with a short interval when they lived in the state of Michigan, spent in this town. The union was blessed with 2 children, one of whom, a boy named Henry died at a very early age. The names of the surviving children are: Peter and Alfred Schuler, Mary Nickasop, Raymond Philomena John, and Floris Schuler all of here. Besides these children the deceased is also survived by her husband, Mr. George Schuler, 3 grandchildren, the following brothers and sisters: John Vanderhorst of here, Mrs. Lizzie Ungarsh, Cincinnati; Agnes Vanderhorst, Mrs. Maggie Manning of here; Mrs. Anna Steinhilber of St. Paul, Ind.; Henry and Ben. Vanderhorst of here, a son-in-law, Fred Nickasop, and a daughter-in-law, Mrs. Helen Schuler.  
 The deceased was a christian woman and a good mother and housewife. She went through hard trials being sick almost constantly for several years.  
 The burial will take place here at St. Augustine cemetery Saturday morning after a requiem high mass at St. Augustine church at 8:30 o'clock, the remains being brought here Thursday afternoon to her late residence on St. Freyburg st.  
 The deceased will be greatly missed by the husband and family as they are left with many children and some of them of rather tender age.
